TRAINING FOR GOVERNORS/TRUSTEES

We offer a programme of professional development sessions for Governors/Trustees. Some of the sessions are offered in partnership with the National Governance Association (NGA).

90-minute sessions can be delivered to Governors/Trustees of individual schools or groups of school.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT UNITS

FOCUS ON THE CORE PURPOSES OF GOVERNANCE AND HOW TO BE HIGHLY EFFECTIVE AS A GOVERNING BOARD

- This is a unit that will serve the purpose of an introduction/induction for new governors/trustees as well as a 'refresher' for those who have been governing for some time.

FOCUS ON SEND:

- How do we ensure that we are meeting the requirements of the governors' responsibilities with respect to pupils with SEND?
- What does the worst case scenario look like and how can we avoid it?
- What are the practical things we can do as governors that will make a difference?

FOCUS ON SAFEGUARDING

- How do we ensure that we are meeting the requirements of the governors' responsibilities with respect to safeguarding?
- What does the worst case scenario look like and how can we avoid it?
- What are the practical things we can do as governors that will make a difference?

FOCUS ON GOVERNOR VISITS TO SCHOOL

- Why is it important that governors visit the school and what should we be doing when we make a visit?
- How can we ensure that the findings from a visit are integrated into the governance process and evidence trail?
- What are the important protocols that need to be established and followed when governors visit the school?

FOCUS ON SECURING VALUE FOR MONEY – THE ROLE OF GOVERNORS IN RELATION TO DEDICATED GRANTS e.g. Pupil Premium

- What is the governors' responsibility around the wise spending of dedicated grants?
- How can we most effectively and simply discharge this responsibility and evidence the governance?
- How do we establish value for money?

- How do governors monitor RE in schools?

GOVERNING BOARDS CAN ALSO COMMISSION TRAINING FOCUSED ON TOPICS NOT COVERED BY THE CORE UNITS:

For example:

- The role of governing boards in relation to health and safety.
- Effective use of pupil performance data.
- Performance management and pay determination.
- 'Restructuring Governance' within a MAT context.

DEVELOPMENT FOR BOARDS' PROGRAMME

The NGA Leading Governance Development for Boards' programme is funded by the Department for Education and is designed for boards governing multi-academy trusts or groups of schools, or boards of schools in opportunity areas where the school is judged to be requiring improvement. This is a consultant-led, bespoke programme, that will be tailored to your board's circumstances, to improve practice and outcomes.

This is a bespoke programme designed for those who are governing in more complex circumstances. The chair or future chair of the governing board will join a development programme for chairs, and will work closely with a consultant analysing an online board self-evaluation, the results of which will inform an action plan for the governing board's development. In addition, the consultant will engage with the whole board and senior leaders so that any further support such as coaching, mentoring and subject-specific training needs can be identified and provided.

This programme consists of development for the board over a period of approximately three terms.

SEND GRADUATED APPROACH TO WORKSHOPS 2018/19 FOR GOVERNORS

SUPPORT TOOLS FOR SELF-REVIEW/PEER-REVIEW

These tools can be used to evaluate the current effectiveness of the governance arrangements of the School/Trust.

Three tools are available for:

- Maintained Schools including Federated Schools
- Single Academies
- Multi Academy Trusts

The tools come with some guidance about how they can be used by an individual governing board and as a part of the school's peer-review process. Having identified their profile of governance strengths and weaknesses, governing boards will then be able to identify which parts of the Stronger Governance offer they are going to engage with to ensure that they are working as effectively as possible

CONSULTANCY

Lincolnshire Teaching Schools Together (LTT) has worked with the Lincolnshire Learning Partnership (LLP) and the Leaders of Governance based in Lincolnshire Schools to develop a consultancy support model to help schools, academies and MATs to strengthen their governance arrangements and to help them to address specific governance challenges they are facing.

LEADERS OF GOVERNANCE SUPPORT

Lincolnshire has a team of experienced governance support consultants to help governing boards to strengthen their work and to respond effectively to the ever-increasing demands being made on them.

Support can be in the form of phone calls, email correspondence, face-to-face meetings, attendance at governance meetings etc.

Examples of support include:

- Support for new chairs
- Support for setting up effective MAT governance arrangements
- Support for self-review and peer-to-peer review
- Supporting strategic planning – vision, values, strategic procedures
- Review and development of governance documentation
- Supporting self-/peer-review using the review tool

Costs: £450 per day / £225 per half-day equivalent

EXTERNAL ADVISER FOR EFFECTIVE HEADTEACHER PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT

Headteachers who are working within the School Teachers' Pay and Conditions (STPC) are required to be appraised by their Governing Board in line with regulations and their pay progression must be linked to this.

The STPC requires that the Governing Board is supported by an external adviser and this is available from Leaders of Governance.

Costs: To be agreed with the appointed LTT adviser

EXTERNAL REVIEWS OF GOVERNANCE

An external review of governance looks at how well your school/academy's Governing Body is working. A trained Leader of Governance works with the Governing Body, Headteacher and Clerk to improve the performance of your Governing Body.

Ofsted will sometimes recommend that a school has a review. In this case, the purpose of the review is to enable a school to move from a rating of 'requires improvement' or 'inadequate' to at least 'good'. The review is designed as support to improve and develop governance, and not as an additional inspection. It will help your Governing Body to identify priorities for improvement, and provide support on what steps to take.

Costs: An external review of Governance will usually take between 2 to 3 days, including a follow-up visit to review impact. The charge for a full review will be agreed between the reviewer and the school/academy. However, the estimated cost is around £1,000 to £1,500. Shorter 'health-check' style reviews are also available at £225 per half-day equivalent.

GOVERNOR SUPPORT

Lincolnshire County Council maintains a Governor Support hotline (01522 553240) to provide telephone advice and support to the Governing Body of a school/academy. In addition to the support offer made within this brochure, Governor Support can also provide remote support via email (governorsupport@lincolnshire.gov.uk) for the purposes of looking over school-related documentation and governance-related matters.

LCC Governor Support is also responsible for maintaining records of Governing Bodies, as well as providing direct communications that are pertinent to supporting the continual development of governance in Lincolnshire Schools.

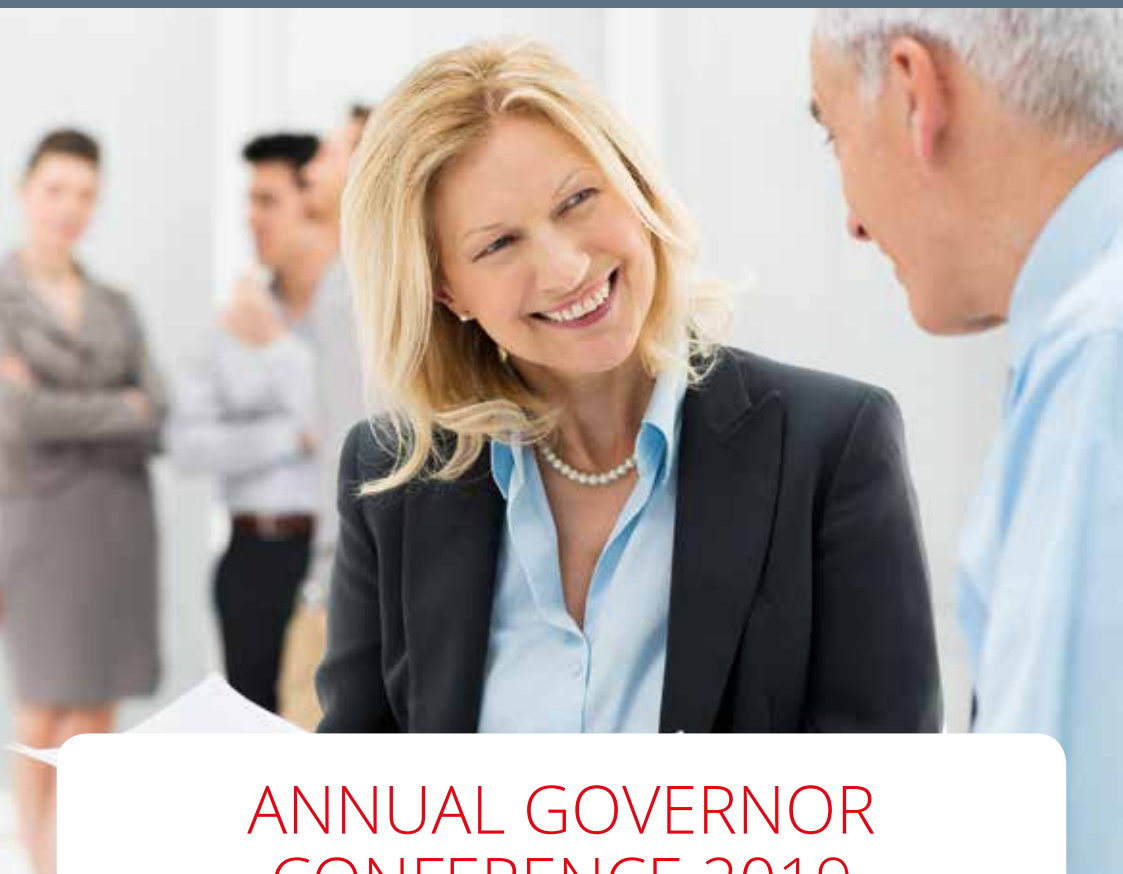
